Honoring Our Past, Inspiring Our Future,

John Adams' famous letter of July 3, 1776, in which he wrote to his wife Abigail what his thoughts were about celebrating the Fourth of July is found on various web sites but is usually incorrectly quoted. Following is the exact text from his letter with his original spellings:

“The Second Day of July 1776, will be the most memorable Epocha, in the History of America. I am apt to believe that it will be celebrated, by succeeding Generations, as the great anniversary Festival. It ought to be commemorated, as the Day of Deliverance by solemn Acts of Devotion to God Almighty. It ought to be solemnized with Pomp and Parade, with Shews, Games, Sports, Guns, Bells, Bonfires and Illuminations from one End of this Continent to the other from this Time forward forever more. You will think me transported with Enthusiasm but I am not. I am well aware of the Toil and Blood and Treasure, that it will cost Us to maintain this Declaration, and support and defend these States. Yet through all the Gloom I can see the Rays of ravishing Light and Glory. I can see that the End is more than worth all the Means. And that Posterity will triumph in that Days Transaction, even altho We should rue it, which I trust in God We shall not.”

Declaration of Independence

It was adopted on July 4, 1776, declaring the American colonies' independence from British rule. Authored primarily by Thomas Jefferson, it outlines the philosophical justification for independence. The document emphasizes the principles of individual rights and government by consent of the governed. It asserts that all men are created equal and have unalienable rights, including life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. The Declaration inspired other nations and movements advocating for constitutional republicanism and human rights. It serves as a foundational text for American identity and values, influencing the U.S. Constitution and Bill of Rights.



The Statue of Liberty

When the statue arrived from France in 1885, she wasn't green at all. She was the color of a brand-new penny—a shiny reddish-brown copper. The statue was a gift from the people of France to celebrate American independence and friendship between the two nations. Over about 20 years, the copper reacted with air, moisture, and salt from New York Harbor, forming a green patina. Scientists discovered the patina actually protects the copper beneath from corrosion. So the green color remained. The torch symbolizes enlightenment, while the broken chains at her feet symbolize freedom from oppression.



Mount Rushmore

Sculptor Gutzon Borglum wanted the monument to tell the story of the nation's first 150 years. Each president was chosen for a reason:
George Washington. Leader of the Revolutionary War and first president.
Thomas Jefferson. Authored the Declaration of Independence, champion of constitutional republicanism.
Abraham Lincoln. Kept the Union together and helped end slavery.
Theodore Roosevelt. Expanded America's role in the world and championed conservation and national parks.



The American Eagle

In 1782, the bald eagle was chosen for the Great Seal of the United States. The Founding Fathers wanted an animal found only in North America. The eagle represented strength, courage, freedom and independence. Its wide wingspan and soaring flight made it a fitting symbol for a young nation seeking its own path. Today, the eagle carries Arrows (readiness to defend) An olive branch (peace). The symbolism reflects America's hope for peace, but willingness to protect itself.
